- 2 Insert the included ATI Installation CD into your CD-ROM drive.
- 3 Click the ATI REMOTE WONDER II icon on the ATI CD Install screen. Follow the on-screen instructions, and then allow the computer to restart.
- 4 Plug the remote receiver into any available USB port on your computer. The ATI REMOTE WONDER II icon will appear on the Windows taskbar. Your ATI REMOTE WONDER II is ready to use!
